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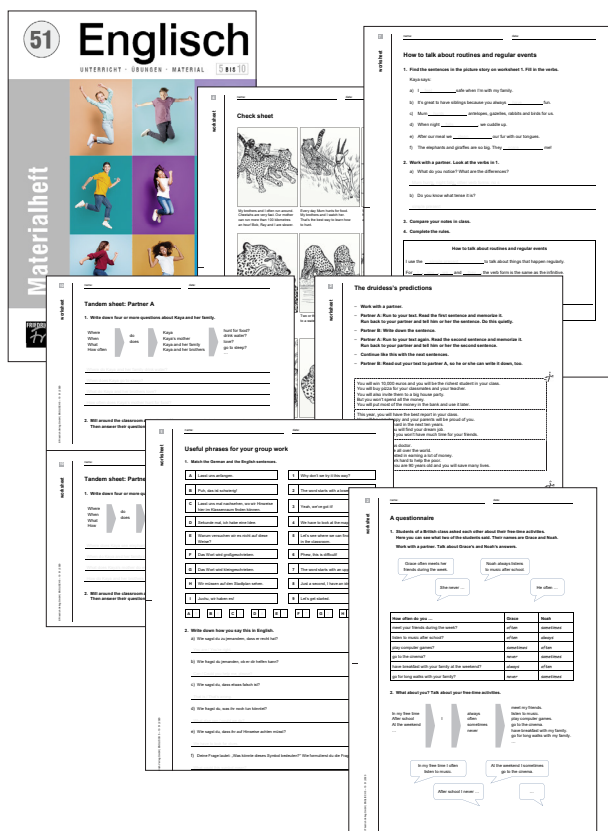

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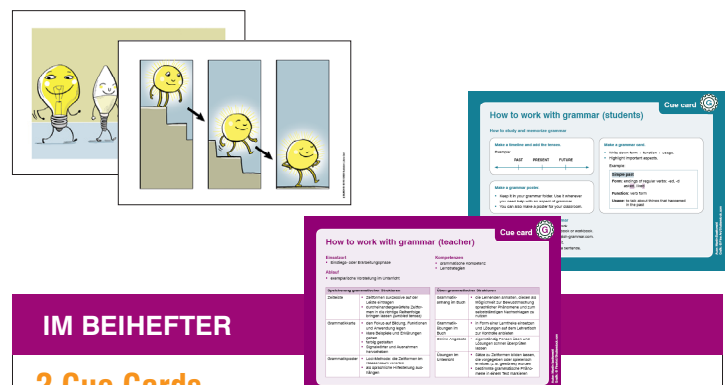

Timeline

The poster illustrates various English verb tenses along a timeline from past to future. It includes:

- Past perfect:** Amy had played video games. Amy hadn't played video games. Had Amy played video games? After Amy had played video games, she walked the dog.
- Simple present:** Amy plays video games. Amy doesn't play video games. Does Amy play video games? Amy often plays video games in her room after school.
- Present perfect:** Amy has played video games. Amy hasn't played video games. Has Amy played video games? Amy has played video games at night.
- Will-Future:** Amy will play video games. Amy won't play video games. Will Amy play video games? Next weekend Amy will probably play video games.
- Simple past:** Amy played video games. Amy didn't play video games. Did Amy play video games? Last night Amy played video games with her brother.
- Present progressive:** Amy is playing video games. Amy isn't playing video games. Is Amy playing video games? Amy is playing video games at the moment.
- Future with going to:** Amy is going to play video games. Amy isn't going to play video games. Is Amy going to play video games? Tonight Amy is going to play video games with Joe.
- Past progressive:** Amy was playing video games. Amy wasn't playing video games. Was Amy playing video games? Amy was playing video games when her best friend called.

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
